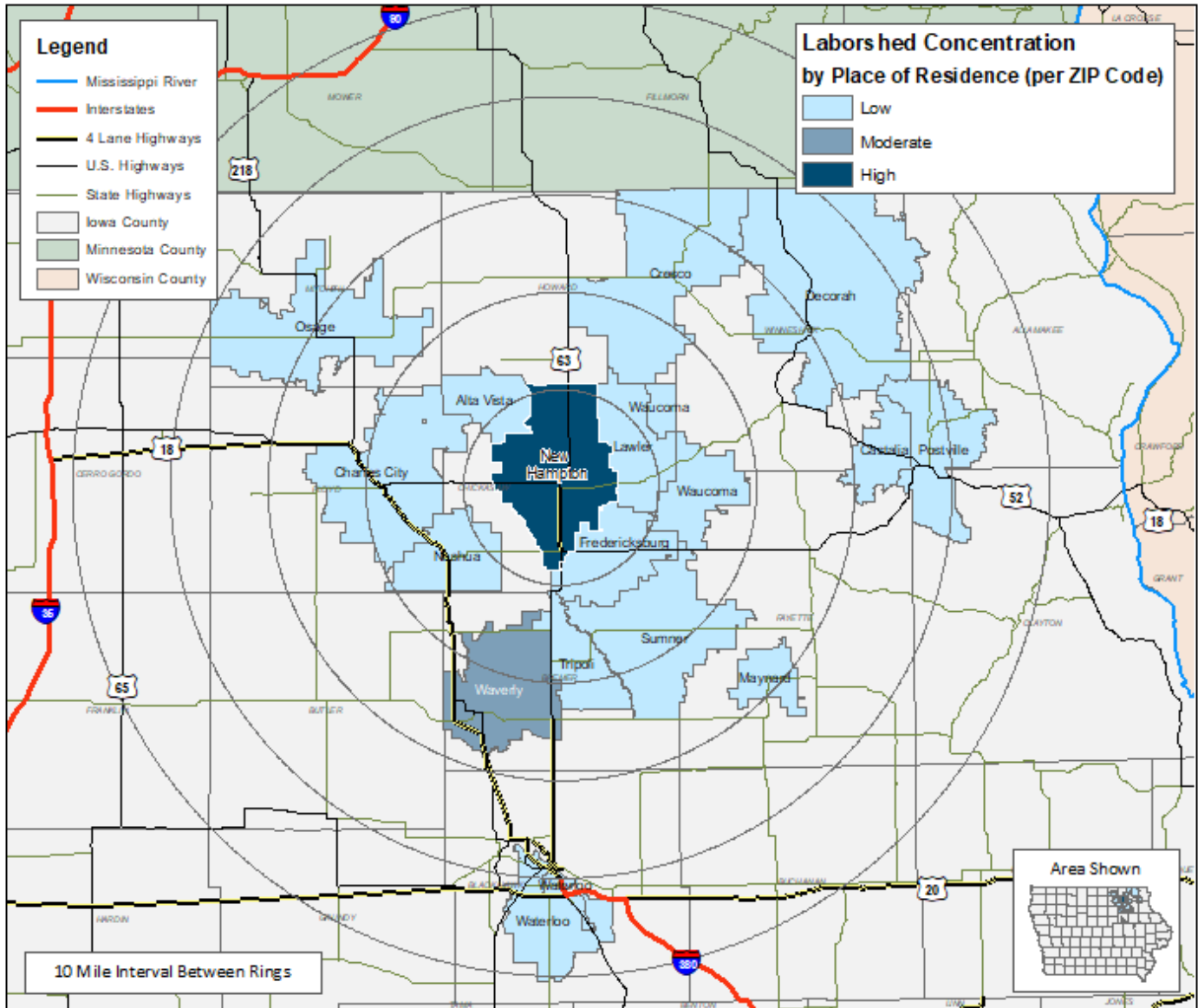

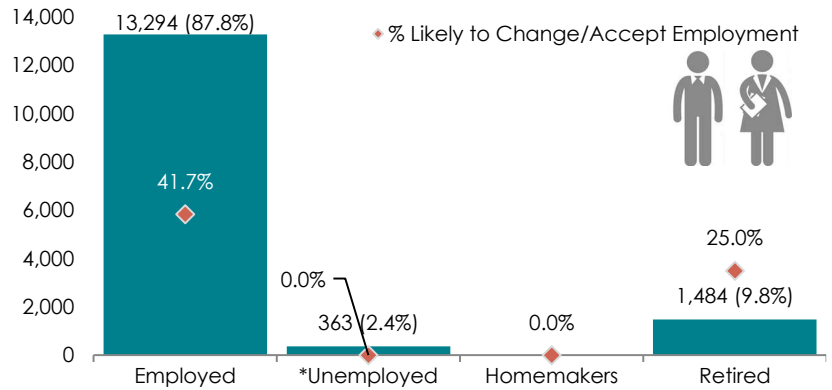

ESTIMATED TOTAL BY EMPLOYMENT STATUS (PERCENTAGE):



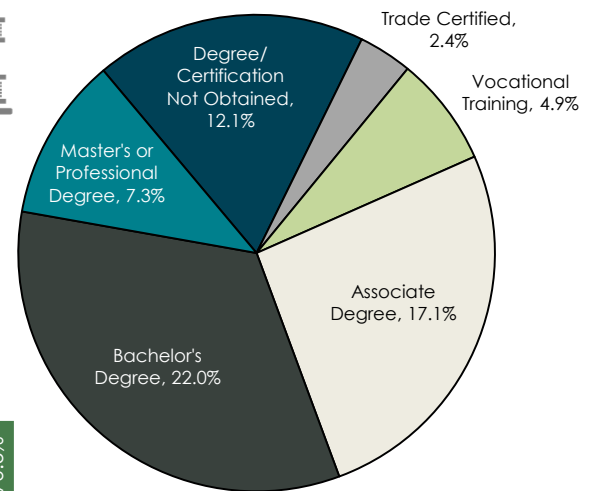

EMPLOYMENT STATS:

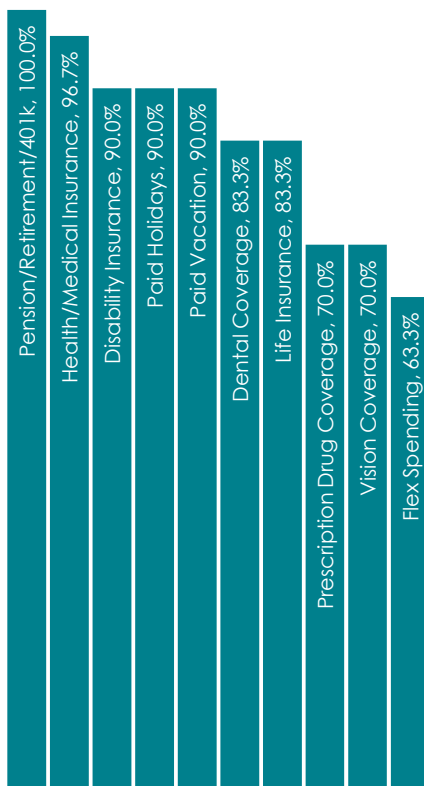
- 45.0% paid an hourly wage
